There are over 1,300 schools across England, Scotland, Northern Ireland, and Wales that have achieved Silver and over 600 schools that have been awarded Gold, the next step up and highest accolade granted by UNICEF UK. ### AED - Defibrillator in school

An Automated External Defibrillator (AED or 'defibrillator') is a machine that is placed externally on the body and is used to give an electric shock when a person is in cardiac arrest i.e., when the heart suddenly stops pumping blood around the body. Cardiac arrest can affect people of any age and without warning. If this happens, swift action is vital, and you must call 999 immediately for an ambulance. While the ambulance crew are on their way, early cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and prompt defibrillation can help save a person's life.

Modern defibrillators are simple and safe to operate and use. Once attached, the defibrillator will automatically analyse the individual's heart rhythm and, if required, apply a shock to restart it or advise that CPR should be continued. The department has supplied schools in England with Mediana A-15 defibrillators. The Mediana A-15 has both visual and voice prompts to guide the rescuer through the entire process from when the device is first opened.

Portobello's AED is at the main entrance - when school is open this can be used by the whole school community and the wider public too. Please read our separate guide which could help save someone's life.

This week our school was invited to visit the field of remembrance at Saltwell Park. Year 6, on behalf of all the children at Portobello Primary, met a representative from the British Legion and placed hand decorated crosses to show respect for all military personnel past and present.
